1. Executive Summary

1.1. This paper provides an update on in-year recruitment and delivery of the key performance indicators 2024-25.

2. Recommendations

2.1. The Committee is recommended to **note** the progress in delivering the key performance indicators 2024-25.

3. Report

- **3.1.** Data available at this point in the academic year provides a summary of enrolments for the 2024-25 session. Against a total credit target of 343,462, we are currently forecasting to achieve 344,113 a positive variance of 651. This continues to illustrate successful student recruitment for the year.
- **3.2.** The regional delivery to SIMD10¹ cohort is forecast to be 94,179 against a target of 95,300. This is a shortfall of 1,121. This means that 27.4% of Glasgow college credits are currently provided to learners residing in the most deprived postcodes.
- **3.3.** The target for delivery to care-experienced learners is on track for delivery against the credit target, projected at 23,463 against a target of 23,400, equating to 6.8% of all learners.
- **3.4.** Please note there is no formal Foundation Apprenticeship target for enrolments in 2024-25 as these are included in overall core credit data. As has been noted in previous committee meetings, foundation apprenticeship numbers present a significant challenge.

4. Risk and Compliance Analysis

4.1. Overarching delivery performance indicators are monitored, alongside associated learning and teaching elements, to provide assurance and effective planning of provision and delivery in the Glasgow college region.

5. Financial and Resource Analysis

5.1. There are no additional financial implications associated with this report. The success of the Glasgow colleges, in meeting the overall credit target, reduces the risk of financial penalties.

6. Equalities Implications

6.1. There are no additional equalities implications associated with this report beyond the data presented. The Glasgow colleges are generally delivering at, or beyond, targets in specific protected characteristic or demographic groups.

7. Learner Implications

7.1. The monitoring report provides assurance that the Glasgow colleges are on track to achieve the overall credit target.
